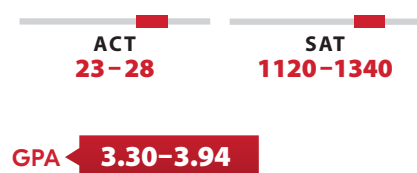

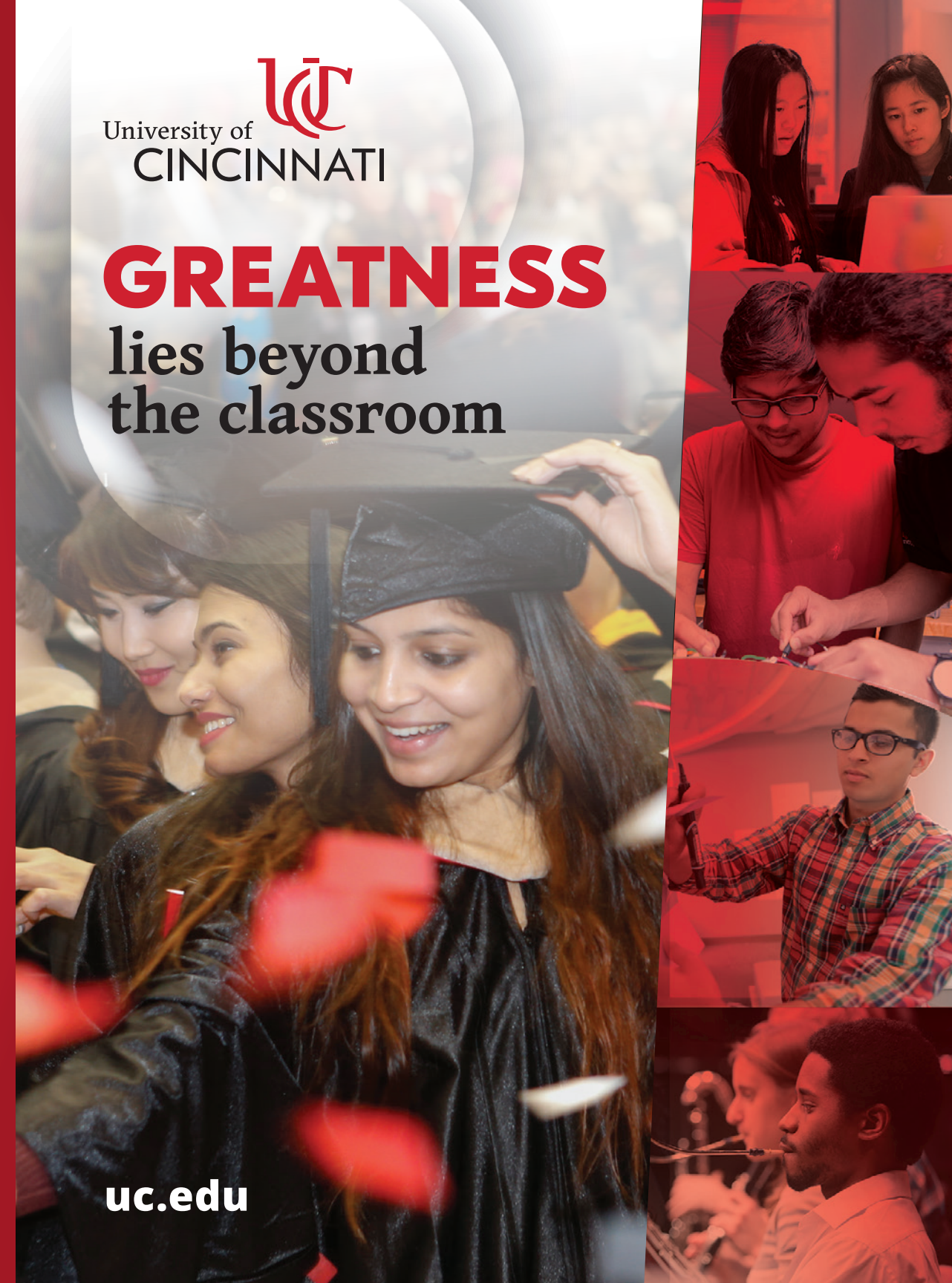

WHAT IS CO-OP?

Better than an internship, co-op is semesters of paid, full-time work in your field. On average students earn \$40,000 through total co-op earnings. Students receive guidance on resumes and interviewing, and a database of 100s of employers to work for. Engineering, IT, Design, Business, and Communication all offer co-op experiences.

HIGH SCHOOL TRANSCRIPTS

- Official transcripts showing the current year's subjects and the previous 3 years' subjects.
- You can request that a high school official upload the transcripts via the Common Application, OR you can submit the official or notarized, sealed transcripts through the physical mail.
- Transcripts should include a certified English translation, if needed.

PROOF OF ENGLISH ABILITY

UC uses the following tests for Proof of English Ability.

- SAT-I
- ACT
- ELS CERTIFICATE
- IELTS
- TOEFL
- PTE

PROOF OF MATH ABILITY

The Proof of Math Ability requirement may be satisfied by submitting scores from any of the following exams:

- SAT-I
- ACT
- UC Math Placement Test

Full-time tuition rates

During co-op semesters, undergraduate students pay only a \$465 professional practice fee.

SCHOLARSHIPS

UC international scholarships award between \$1,000 and \$26,000 per year to qualified students, with an average award of \$7,000. While test scores and GPA are considered, all aspects of an application are used to determine amounts.
