About UC's Master of Public Health

The mission of the University of Cincinnati's Master of Public Health (MPH) program is to prepare students to provide leadership in public health practice and research through generating, evaluating, and applying evidence to improve the public's health. This education is provided from a multidisciplinary perspective, employing active learning strategies, and in collaboration with the full array of community institutions and organizations involved in the health of the public.

UC MPH offers concentrations in the following fields of study

- Biostatistics
- Environmental Public Health
- Epidemiology
- Health Education & Promotion
- Health Services Management
- Occupational Public Health



Curriculum

Core courses are scheduled so that students with other day-time responsibilities can pursue the degree. Students are encouraged to complete the core sequence before taking concentration courses. Full-time students will be able to complete the degree program in 18-24 months of study.

The core courses include:

- Health Systems and Health Policy
- Epidemiology for Public Health
- Biostatistics for Public Health
- Environmental Public Health
- Social & Behavioral Foundations of Public Health

The **practicum** is an individually-planned, supervised, and evaluated practice experience through which the student will develop an understanding of, and appreciation for the practice of core knowledge & skill sets of public health in a field setting.

The **culminating** experience allows the student to apply theory and principles in a situation that approximates some aspect of professional problem solving practice. Faculty evaluate the students' mastery of the core concentration competencies.

Admission Criteria

Program admission is based upon review of the complete set of credentials submitted by each candidate:

- A baccalaureate degree and proof of official transcripts from an accredited college or university
- A letter or brief essay
- Three letters of recommendation
- Official GRE scores
- International students must take TOEFL exam
